<u>Homework</u>

This term we will give the children literacy and numeracy homework on alternate weeks. The homework will be set on a **Friday and must be returned** by the following Thursday. Please ensure you read the letter regarding homework and our expectations, which has been stuck in the front of the yellow homework book.

Please help your child to be responsible for their homework books and bring them in on the appropriate day. If you or your child has any questions about the homework, please see your class teacher before the end of the week for clarification. We also expect the children to continue to read

aloud to their parents/carers on a daily basis as this is essential for their reading development. Please continue to write in the children's reading records - at the back of homework books.

Spellings

Spelling tests take place every **Friday** with new spellings also sent home that day. Spelling lists will be in the <u>back</u> of children's homework books. It is important that homework books are in school <u>every Friday</u> in order for new spelling lists to be stuck in. Spellings for the term are also posted on your child's class web page in case they become mislaid.

PPA

This term our PPA is on a Friday afternoon, during which the children will be taught PE by the Shine coaches and French by Madame Maurier.

PE

Although PE is timetabled for Monday and Friday this term, the children **must** have their PE kit in school every day as due to our busy schedule we might have to be flexible with our timetable. We would ask that you send PE kit back to school if it is taken home after a Shine session at the end of the day so that the children are always able to participate fully in the P.E. curriculum. P.E kit should consist of a blue or white t-shirt, black or blue shorts and trainers. Hoodies and leggings underneath shorts are permitted when the weather turns colder.
